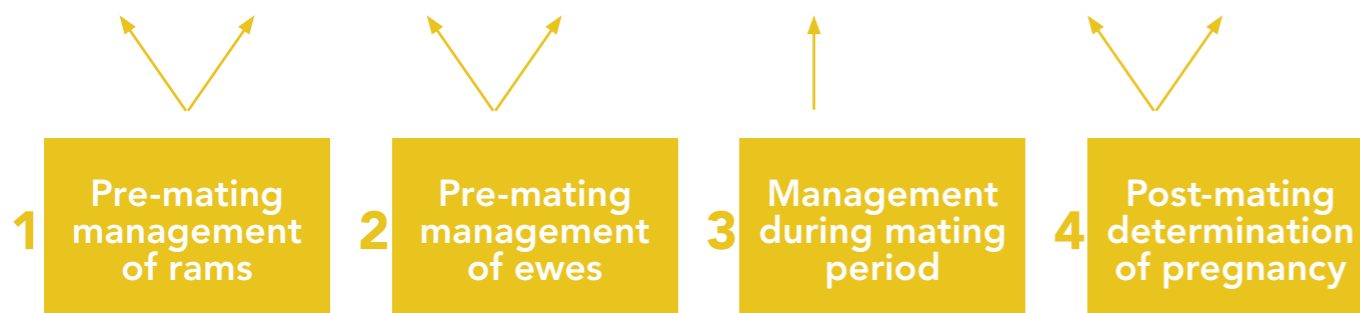




Fill in the months of the year beginning with the month you want to start the mating season (April, in this example), then add the rest of the months.

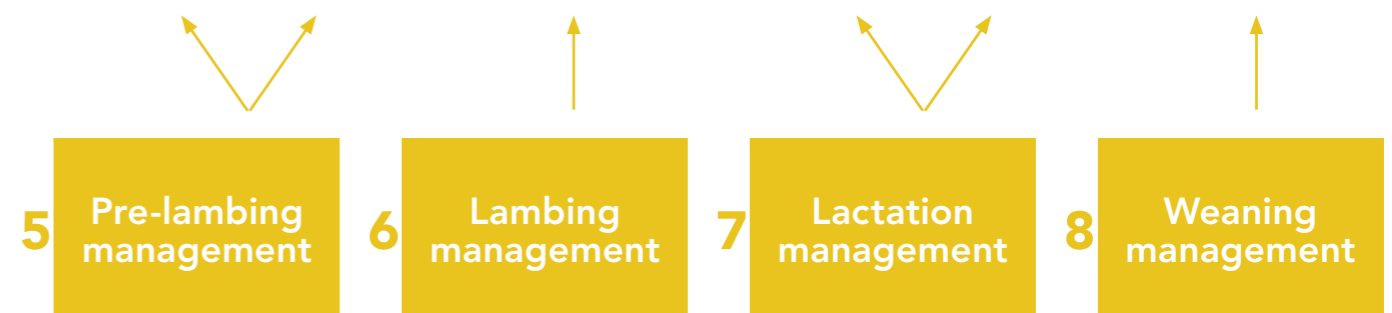
